Protecting the Vulnerable

- » At the outset of the COVID-19 pandemic, ACLU of Arkansas wrote to every criminal legal system stakeholder in the state with a comprehensive list of demands for how to prevent jails and prisons from becoming powderkegs for the disease.
- » As COVID-19 outbreaks swept through Arkansas prisons, ACLU of Arkansas joined civil rights groups in challenging the state's failure to protect people in custody.
- » Representing a renter facing eviction and potential criminal penalties after losing their job due to COVID-19, the ACLU of Arkansas and its partners filed suit challenging the constitutionality of the state's criminal eviction statute.





Black Lives Matter

» Throughout the protests against the murder of George Floyd, the ACLU of Arkansas worked to protect people's rights, provided advice to and helped secure legal representation for those charged while exercising their fundamental right to protest.

Defending Reproductive Liberty

 When Arkansas officials tried to use the pandemic as an excuse to block people from abortion care, the ACLU of Arkansas sued
resulting in a temporary restraining order and a loosening of the restrictions.



Voter & Election Protection

» Through grassroots organizing and voter education, the ACLU of Arkansas' Voter Protection Project helped educate hundreds of thousands of Arkansans about their voting rights, helping to achieve record turnout across the state.



Police Reform & Accountability

» A report from the ACLU found that police shootings in Arkansas have continued despite the pandemic, with people of color disproportionately impacted.

FACT

Arkansas's rate of death by police shootings over the last five years is the **10th highest in the country**.
